

(1) Verb: to be [present tense, AFFIRMATIVE]

Subject pronoun	Affirmative	Contracted
I	am	I'm
you <small>(singular)</small>	are	you're
he / she / it	is	he's / she's
we	are	we're
you <small>(plural)</small>	are	you're
they	are	they're

(2) Verb: to be [present tense, NEGATIVE]

Subject pronoun	Affirmative	Negative / contracted
I	am	am <u>not</u> / I'm not
you <small>(singular)</small>	are	are <u>not</u> / you're not / you aren't
he / she / it	is	is <u>not</u> / he's not / he isn't
we	are	are <u>not</u> / we're not / we aren't
you <small>(plural)</small>	are	are <u>not</u> / you're not / you aren't
they	are	are <u>not</u> / they're not / they aren't

(3) Verb: to be [present tense, QUESTION]

Subject pronoun	Affirmative	Question [inverted + ?]
I	am	Am I?
you <small>(singular)</small>	are	Are you?
he / she / it	is	Is he? / Is she?
we	are	Are we?
you <small>(plural)</small>	are	Are you?
they	are	Are they?
