## What is an (Un)essay?

\*The short answer\* - An \*unessay\* is a writing project done for the purpose of exploring questions and ideas of interest to the writer and not for the purpose of learning a narrow and static set of "rules" (ex. don't use "I", use 5 paragraphs, MLA format, etc.).

# DR. CARMEN TEACHES

Writing critically with and from multiple, informed sources is perhaps the single, most common trademark for the kind of writing and thinking that is expected of you in the academy. However, this does NOT mean:

- \*that you write about things you don't care about,
- \*that you write as if you sound like an encyclopedia/Wikipedia,
- \*that you omit your own voice and perspective, that you cannot be creative and energetic...

...indicates that in order to become better writers we are going to have to "undo" the potential damage done to the spirit of the essay (and most real writing) by the many approaches to teaching writing that frame essays (and most other forms of writing) as a set of rules to be mastered in order to not lose points.

This means that there are no formal requirements like **MIA Format** or page length or even that your writing project has to be words on 8.5" x 11" paper. If you can accomplish your purpose in 5 pages, great. Or maybe you need 16 pages. If your writing will be more effective by incorporating images and other media into your work, then do it. Maybe your project is best presented as a video or as an audio essay or an interactive webpage. Then use video, or sound, or other forms of multimedia. Maybe you speak another language or even multiple forms of English and using this language in your work will be effective – do it.

The slightly longer answer – There's a good chance that you've come into this class with the expectation that you will be writing something called "papers" or "essays." Great! Essays, as I hope you'll experience them in this class are wonderful things. However, my experience also generally shows me that students come into an English class with the idea that these things called essays (or papers) are unyieldingly inflexible, rule-bound monsters. For example, if you've been told never to use the personal pronoun "I" in an essay or that an essay should always be 5 paragraphs, you've experienced this "essay as rule-bound monster" approach to writing.




Daniel Paul O'Donnell developed by the "Unessay" was originally developed by mediaeval and textual studies scholars.  
The "Unessay" is a writing project that calls attention to the idea that essays (and many other forms of writing) are actually very flexible and open and can be used to explore and discuss — take action on!!! — nearly any topic that matters to you. The "unessay" invites us to resist overly prescriptive definitions of what an essay / even writing in general -- is or can be.
