Students typically take 6 classes at a time.		Full-time students must take at least 12 credits and typically take three 5-credit classes per quarter.
Homework often due each class period; teachers often give homework reminders.		Faculty assign work that is due at various times. Students need to independently track deadlines.
There might be <u>dedicated time</u> for homework during class time.		Dedicated homework time during class time is rare.
For every one hour of class time in high school, students can expect about 30 minutes of homework. This class time to homework time means that there's a 2:1 ratio .		For every credit hour, students can expect 5 hours of homework. This credit hour to homework time is a 1:2 ratio
Parents can access their student's Learning Management System (Schoology, Canvas, etc.).		No one can access a student's record without the student's written permission. Students must submit a Release of Information to the Enrollment Services Office.
Each HS has a standardized GPA/grade system which all teachers use.	%	Each faculty member may use a different grading scale . For example, in one class 94%=4.0, while in another class 96%=4.0.
High school classes traditionally meet at least 3 days a week.		College classes typically meet 1, 2, or 3 days per week. Asynchronous online classes do not have standard class meetings.
High School class modes are standardized across the school (all online/hybrid during pandemic but pre-pandemic classes met fully in physical classrooms).		College class modes vary , including online, hybrid, and web-enhanced (face-to-face).

Students can often get extra help from high school teachers **during class time**.



Students can often get extra help from faculty during faculty office hours.

Responsibility **is shared** (counselors, teachers, parents, and students).



Responsibility lies with the student.

<u>High School Counselors</u> offer support with academic achievement, college preparation, post-secondary options, and social/emotional support.



<u>Academic Advisors</u> offer support with academic degrees, plans, degree options, quarterly planning, transfer prep, and course selections.

Guardians instigate and manage student IEPs and 504s, which frequently roll over year to year without new documentation.



<u>Students self-identify</u> and provide medical documentation to request accommodations from Student Accessibility Services.

IEPs/504s focus on success measures.



Accommodations focus on access measures.

Mental Health Services are contracted through the school district, and students can access a variety of partnering institutions.



CASCADIA College The **College Counseling Center** offers confidential, professional, and free psychological counseling. All students pre-pay for 6 sessions out of their student fees.
